6.1 Indigenous Relations Advisor

- City Staff participated in the Jordan Principle Training on Friday, November 22nd, 2024, through the First Nations Health Consortium. Jordan's Principle supports First Nations programming by filling a fundamental gap in funding that provides services for First Nations people. The training is 1.5 to 2 hours long and is free for Grande Prairie organizations to host.
- National Ribbon Skirt Day is on Saturday, January 4th, 2025
- Len Morissette's Water World Premier will be held on January 9th, 2025, at the NWP, Douglas J. Cardinal Theatre. Admission is free and doors open at 6pm and the show starts at 6:30pm.
- Grande Prairie Friendship Centre is celebrating Winter Solstice December 20th from 4-8 pm at the Evergreen Park Old Timers cabin. There will be teachings, crafting, food and wagon rides through the light show
