Collaborate with Partners in Transition to Municipal Police Service

Priorities - Policing Transition from RCMP to GPPS

1. Work with Grande Prairie Police Service to integrate service delivery.
Target: Demobilize 20 RCMP Regular Members (RM).
 - I. 31 have transitioned from Grande Prairie Detachment
 - II. 38 RM's with transfer planning documents.

2. Bilateral Operations amongst GPPS & RCMP on a bi-weekly basis.
Target: 20 meetings per year.
 - I. 1st Quarter: 12 completed.
 - II. 2nd Quarter: 12 completed.
 - III. In September, meetings were discontinued.
 - IV. In December meetings initiated once again.
 - V. 3rd Quarter: Three completed.
 - VI. YTD: 27 completed

3. Employee Wellness - Ongoing discussions with all employees through daily shift briefings.
Target: Four per week. 150 per year.
 - I. 1st Quarter: 50 completed.
 - II. 2nd Quarter: 60 completed.
 - III. iii. 3rd Quarter: 47 completed.
