Collaborate with Partners in Transition to Municipal Police Service

Priorities - Policing Transition from RCMP to GPPS

1. Work with Grande Prairie Police Service to integrate service delivery.
Target: Demobilize 20 RCMP Regular Members (RM).
 - I. 48 have transitioned from Grande Prairie Detachment
 - II. 5 RCMP Sergeant's remain whom require transfer planning.
2. Bilateral Operations amongst GPPS & RCMP on a bi-weekly basis.
Target: 20 meetings per year.
 - I. YTD: 39 completed
3. Employee Wellness - Ongoing discussions with all employees through daily shift briefings.
Target: Four per week. 150 per year.
 - I. YTD: 203 completed.
4. 'K' Division Career Development and Resourcing Officer engagements with RM's.
Target: One formal meeting per year.
 - I. 97% of RM's have received transferring planning documents.
 - II. On April 15th, 2026, 'K' Division Criminal Operations Officer, Assistant Commissioner Wayne Nichols attended the Grande Prairie City RCMP Detachment and discussed career planning with all RCMP RM's in attendance.
