Priorities - Policing Transition from RCMP to GPPS

1. Work with Grande Prairie Police Service to integrate service delivery.
Target: Demobilize all remaining (47) RCMP Regular Members (RM).
 - I. 65 have transitioned from Grande Prairie Detachment
 - II. 39 remaining to demobilize.
 - III. 1 RCMP Sergeant remains whom require transfer planning.

3. Employee Wellness - Ongoing discussions with all employees through daily shift briefings.

Build Trust and Confidence in Policing Service Delivery

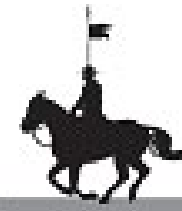
Priorities – Community Engagement and Diversity
