What is a Neighbourhood Association?

A neighbourhood association brings residents together to help create safe, welcoming, and connected communities.

Whether you're interested in organizing community events, enhancing neighbourhood safety, creating opportunities for neighbours to connect, or having a voice in the planning and development of your community, a neighbourhood association provides a way to make a positive local impact.

Neighbourhood associations are volunteer-led organizations that work collaboratively to build stronger, more vibrant communities for everyone.



Checklist for Forming a Neighbourhood Association:

Build Community Interest & Support



Start by connecting with your neighbours and hosting an information session or community meeting to gauge interest.

Establish a Volunteer Board of Directors



Identify residents who are willing to serve on the board, determine your neighbourhood boundaries, and develop and approve your association's bylaws.

Incorporate as a Society



Register your neighbourhood association as a society through the Government of Alberta: alberta.ca/incorporate-a-society

Apply for Available Funding



Once incorporated, neighbourhood associations are eligible to apply for an annual Operating Grant and the Community Improvement Grant. Learn more at: cityofgp.com/NeighbourhoodAssociations/grants-available-neighbourhood-associations
