GARDENING TIPS FOR USING PEAT PELLETS & SEEDS

Tips for Picking a Jar or Container

You can use items you already have around your house to plant your seeds in, such as;

Mason jars

- Peanut butter containers
- Sour cream containers
- Egg cartons

- Margarine containers
- Make a container with old newspaper

Now that you have picked out your jar or container, follow these instructions on how to plant.

Tips for Planting

• Zucchini seeds and beet seeds will need to be planted directly into your garden and not in a peat pellet

Place a peat pellet in the container you are going to be using for your seed to grow.

Make sure to add enough water to cover about half the height of your peat pellet.

 Making sure the pellet has absorbed the all of the water, wait 5 to 10 minutes for the pellet to completely expand. If more water is needed you can add more.
 Pour out any excess water from your container.

Slightly tear the top of the netting on the peat pellet.
 You can do this with a pencil or a toothpick. Make a small hole to place your seeds into.

- Now you are ready to plant your seeds! Place one seed in the peat pellet, cover them with the soil you
 moved to the side.
- Now, if you wish, you can make a label for your pellets to remember what you planted.

• Place the container in a warm place out of direct sunlight and wait for the seeds to sprout. Be sure to cover your container with a lid during this step, but not air tight.

 The peat pellets only need to be watered if they are looking dry. If the soil is damp, the pellet doesn't need water.

• Once the seeds have sprouted, you can take the lid off and move the container to a place in your home where it will get sunlight. Water as needed.

Only the seeds that have sprouted can be moved into direct sunlight.
 The other pellets need to stay covered in the container until they have sprouts.

 It is time to transplant the seedlings when they have roots, you should see these through the netting.

 Before moving directly outdoors, harden off your plants by exposing them in short amounts of time outside to get used to the change in light and temperature.

 To transplant the seedlings to your garden, place the pellet directly in the soil and cover.
