Discarded cigarettes are one of the leading causes of preventable fires in our municipality. Do not dispose of cigarettes in planters.

Planters contain peat moss, mulch, or other flammable materials that can ignite easily. Even a small gust of wind can sustain and carry embers from a discarded cigarette, causing fires to spread rapidly.

Improperly Discarded Smoker's Materials

Approved activities or devices/appliances will not prevent potential prosecution or litigation if the user or device/appliance starts a wildfire. This document is for reference only.
