Snow Plowing and Ice Control

Residential roads are plowed in two-week rotations triggered by the City when snow accumulates, or a significant snowfall occurs. When triggered, crews plow on the day before garbage collection, or on Friday if your garbage collection day is Monday. Residential snow removal does not take place on weekends.

Property owners are required to remove snow and ice from public sidewalks adjacent to their property within 24-hours of a snowfall.

Property Taxes

As a property owner in Grande Prairie, you will receive a property tax notice every May. It indicates your share of municipal and education property tax and the payment due date.



Restrictive Covenants, Easements & Caveats

These are legal restrictions placed on a property by an individual, a private company or an organization . For example, a restrictive covenant may specify the colour and style of the fence you can build. A drainage easement is used to convey water from adjacent properties, through your property.

These restrictions on your land are legal agreements and enforcement is resolved through the legal system, not by the City of Grande Prairie. This information is contained on your Land Title, which can be purchased at the Registry Office.



Home Renovations

Permits are required if you are developing unfinished areas, moving interior walls or changing window sizes. They are not required if you're painting walls, replacing flooring or counter tops.



Decks

Permits for decks are required when the deck is:

- more than two feet above grade, and/or
- has a solid roof, and/or
- has two or more solid walls above the decking.

Sheds and Garages

Permits for sheds and garages are required if the building you are looking to construct is over 10m² (108 ft²).

Secondary Suites & Garage Suites

The City regulates properties where suites can be built and several permits are required to build a secondary or garage suite, for detailed information visit:

Fences

Permits are not required. The maximum heights are:

- 1.9m (6'2") in the rear and side yards
- 0.9m (3'0") in the front yard
- 1.0m (3'3") inside a corner visibility triangle



Landscaping and Drainage

Permits are only required if you alter the way the drainage leaves your parcel. You do not need a permit to add topsoil and finished landscaping to a new property.

When landscaping, it is important to refer to the Lot Grading Certificate if available and complete the landscaping according to that document.

All property owners are responsible for maintaining surface grading on their property in a manner that protects their buildings from surface water and does not negatively impact adjacent properties. This includes any grass or concrete drainage swales located on the parcel.

All projects must meet the City's regulations.
