Winter Parking Bans

Residential Areas

 Move vehicles off the street by 8 a.m. on your plow day so crews can clear the whole road.
(Streets with too many parked vehicles may be pushed later in the rotation.)

Priority 1 and 2 Roads

- Parking bans may be declared to keep major routes clear.
- During a ban, no parking is allowed Monday to Friday from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Vehicles left on the road during a declared ban may be ticketed or towed under Traffic Bylaw C-1166.

Snow Storage

- Priority 1 roads: Snow is pushed past the curb onto City boulevards.
- Priority 2 roads: Snow is windrowed to the centre and removed later.
- Residential roads: Snow is stored along the sides of residential streets, pushed up onto the city boulevard or piled in the centre of cul-de-sacs.
- Windrows are stored along the sides of residential streets. Parking beside windrows is not permitted.

Sidewalk Clearing

- Residents must clear snow and ice from sidewalks next to their property within 24 hours of snowfall.
- Shovel snow onto the sides of your driveway or lawn, keeping it on your property and off streets and walkways.

Lawn Ornaments & Plants

To protect decorations, shrubs and trees, place them well back from the curb. Depending on the property, the City-owned boulevard where snow is stored can be up to four metres back from the curb.

Priority Road Clearing

The City maintains Priority 1, 2 and 3 roads during winter:

- Priority 1: Main arterial roads, high-volume primary access roads emergency corridors. These are cleared first to ensure fire, ambulance, and transit access.
- Priority 2: Major collector roads, bus routes and permanent snow routes. Cleared after Priority 1 is complete.
- Priority 3: Industrial and rural roads. Cleared after Priority 2 is complete.

City crews monitor, plow, sand and salt these roads throughout the winter.

Residential Snow Clearing

Accumulated snowfall is monitored in residential areas across the city. When it reaches 10 cm, the City declares residential clearing for all neighbourhoods. Contracted crews then complete a two-week rotation, clearing neighbourhoods in a Week A then Week B cycle.

- Work takes place Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Vehicles must be moved off the street on your neighbourhood plow day.
- Tip: Clearing is scheduled the weekday before your garbage day during your assigned week.

Week A & Week B Schedule

Week A and B assignments tell you what day your neighbourhood is cleared. Week A roads are cleared first, then Week B roads, until all residential areas are complete (weather permitting).
